External Outreach Program: Timor Leste, HatoUdo





*Vocational Education Scholarships for young people from the above village. This program has been running for 3 years following a visit to the above village by members of the SJG in 2014. In 2018 we provided scholarships for 5 young people.

Funds were raised by donations from parishioners and sales of "FairTrade" Chocolates at masses on the third weekend of each month. We are truly appreciative of the generous support from parishioners. This program is coordinated by our local contact, Martinho (who visited this parish in 2017) and the Sr Aurora and her congregation of very dedicated Canossian Sisters working with the local students and people in HatoUdo.

*Special Project: Purchase of equipment in Australia to establish a modest bakery in the village to benefit the local community and provide some employment for young villagers who have been recipients of our scholarships. We were assisted in this project by a generous donation from an Australian Charity (Australian Antigonish Co-Operative Development Ltd.). A decision was sought from the HatoUdo community as to what their priority would be to use the funds. They requested the funds be spent in helping to establish a bakery to produce bread for consumption and sales. In consultation the equipment requested has been purchased and is presently on a ship to Dili, Timor Leste, with assistance from Rotary. Construction has started on the bakery.
